DEPARTMENT #10: 4-H & Vocational

Eligibility: 4-H Club members must have passed their eighth birthday by January 1 of the current year. Exhibitors must be 4-H members, a project in the field in which they wish to make an entry, and be under the supervision of the Pennsylvania State University Cooperative Extension Service by July 1 of the current year preceding the fair.

Students enrolled in an accepted vocational school curriculum must be conducting a project in the class in which they wish to make an entry. Students enrolled in general home economics in comprehensive high school are considered as qualifying. All by entries shall be approved prior to the fair by a member of Pennsylvania Department of Education, Agriculture or Family and Consumer Science staff, or their designated representative. All entries in a class may be divided into 4-H & Vocational if there are sufficient entries (greater than 15). Some of the classes have multiple varieties. These Varieties will be separated at the discretion of the chairperson of the Competition Committee if there are sufficient entries (greater than 10 of a specific variety). All 4-H entries must be accompanied by project book.
