1. This show is sanctioned by the ADGA for the following breeds:

2. Entries due August 12th, entry fees \$3.50 per animal.

4. The base date is August 23, 2017

5. The original registration certificate is required for all animals six months of age or older and this MUST be shown to the Show Secretary before the start of the show.

6. The original registration certificate or duplicate application stamped by the ADGA office is required for all animals under six months of age and this MUST be shown to the Show Secretary before the start of the show.

7. A registration or recordation certificate may be required for animals of any age if the show so chooses.

8. No copies of the registration certificate or the stamped duplicate application, telegrams or phone calls will be accepted in lieu of the original certificate.

9. Health papers are required

10. Animals must be in place by Saturday 12:30 PM on August 26, 2017

And will be released by 7:00 PM on August 26, 2017

11. Judging will begin at 1:30 PM on August 26, 2017

Special Rules Regarding Goats

Show Order is not subject to change

Dairy Goats:

1. American Dairy Goat Association rules shall govern the conduct of the show.

2. Only American Dairy Goat Association, American Goat Society and Canadian Goat Society registered and recorded may be shown. Animals must be owned by April 1. Original papers must accompany animals over 6 months of age, including substitutions. No pending papers will be approved. Original registration certificate or duplicate application stamped by the ADGA office is required for all animals under 6 months of age.

3. All animals must have an official ear tag or official legible breed registration tattoo.

4. Official health certificate issued by an accredited veterinarian shall accompany all goats. See health rules and regulations.

5. The superintendent may limit the number of entries to anyone exhibitor.

6. All animals shown in special classes must have been shown in their regular class.

7. The Senior Champion Class shall consist of all first place winners in classes of Doe in milk.

8. The Junior Champion class shall consist of all first place winners in classes not in milk.

9. No horned animals allowed

10. The Junior and Senior Shows are not separately sanctioned.

Market goats will be judged between the Sheep Show and the dairy goat show by the judge of the sheep show.

DEPARTMENT #8: Eggs

Rules:

1. Exhibitor may enter only one item per entry number.

2. Entries will be judged on:

a. Exterior Quality- Uniformity of size, shape, color, shell texture and condition.

- b. Interior Quality.
- 3. Entries will be disqualified for:
 - a. Total weight less than 20 ounces or over 27 ounces per dozen.
 - b. Showing signs of incubation or germ development.
 - c. Inedibility.
- 4. Entry fees must be submitted with entry form.

Section 2: Producer under 3000 layers.
Class 1: One dozen brown eggs.
Class 2: One dozen white eggs.
Class 3: One dozen other color eggs
Class 4: One dozen other eggs
Class 5: Jumbo Eggs

DEPARTMENT #9: Rabbits and Guinea Pigs

The rabbit and guinea pig show will be held on Saturday, August 26th at 12:00 pm. Exhibitors are responsible to have animals registered and available not later than 11:30 am. Rabbits and guinea pigs must be tattooed in left ear. This show is not sanctioned by PaSRBA or ARBA. The order of the show is as follows.

Rabbits, by sections and classes / Guinea Pigs, by sections and classes
 Management reserves the right to combine Sections and Classes

There will be one award for Showmanship for Rabbits and one for Guinea Pigs. PaSRBA guidelines will apply. Premiums 1st \$5 2ND \$4 3rd \$3

Rules:

1. Pens are provided and rabbits and guinea pigs must stay all three (3) days.
2. All carriers must have leak proof bottoms. Exhibitors are responsible for having their animals at the judging table for the proper class.
3. Entry fees are \$1.00 per entry if pre-registered by August 8th.
4. There will be a Senior, Intermediate and Junior class for heavy meat breeds. There will be Senior and Junior classes for all others.
5. Health requirements: All stock will be screened for eye and nasal discharge upon entry to the show area. Any animals showing signs of same will be disqualified. In addition, judges will eliminate any stock found to be diseased while judging.
6. All animals must be the legitimate property of the exhibitor prior to the show.
7. All animals will be exhibited in their natural condition. Included in violations are dying, plucking, trimming, or any other action designed to deceive.
8. Show management reserves the right to combine classes when necessary.
9. Judges decisions are final.
